### Scholarship:

Theresa Chua, class of 2023, was awarded the Helen Cashatt Drais Memorial Adelphe Scholarship for Scholarship Excellence. We are so proud of Theresa and all her hard work. She is an exemplary model of what it means to be a Kappa scholar, and we are so lucky to call her our sister!

### Chapter Philanthropy:



Our Lemonade Stand Challenge was a hit in Spring '21. Raising money for breast cancer is a meaningful cause for all of our members since one in three women experience it, and unfortunately many of our members' families have been touched by it. We banded together to create a festive and exciting afternoon handing out lemonade to our fellow Pards in the very heart of campus, the Quad. We contacted local news stations to cover our event and were interviewed on local television. In Spring 2021, Zeta Beta also supported local Easton organizations including Second Harvest Food Bank, Lafayette Mutual Aid, St. Baldrick's and PASA through various fundraising and volunteer events.

In Fall 2021, Zeta Beta again supported the Second Harvest Food Bank, and held a Thanksgiving food drive for them. We set up various stations where students could donate dry or canned food that was distributed to people with food insecurity through various non-profits. Second Harvest's advocacy to end hunger is one that resonates with us in Zeta Beta.

We selected Mental Health America as the organization for our philanthropic focus. We planned various events to raise awareness for their mission statements, such as the importance of mental health, and fundraised for them. One of our events in honor of MHA was 'Movement for Mindfulness', in which a member of Kappa led a yoga session, open to all students at Lafayette, to encourage self-care and the importance of mental health. We also partnered with a local cafe (Mojo 516), where a percentage of profits were donated to MHA.



### Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion:

In the past year, our second ever DEI Chair was confirmed. A microaggressions training was administered in advance of recruitment. Our first in-person DEI training, a cultural appropriation workshop, took place. Starting in Fall '21, the chapter created a monthly calendar of DEI and multicultural events, with specific events spotlighted on a biweekly basis. We are working on greater DEI-related social media activity, establishing anonymous forums for feedback/suggestions and working with the other Fraternities and Sororities & the college to strengthen an inclusive and positive campus environment.

We are returning to "normal", holding in-person meetings in the chapter room. The chapter had a successful recruitment in the Fall '21 and we are resuming our social events.

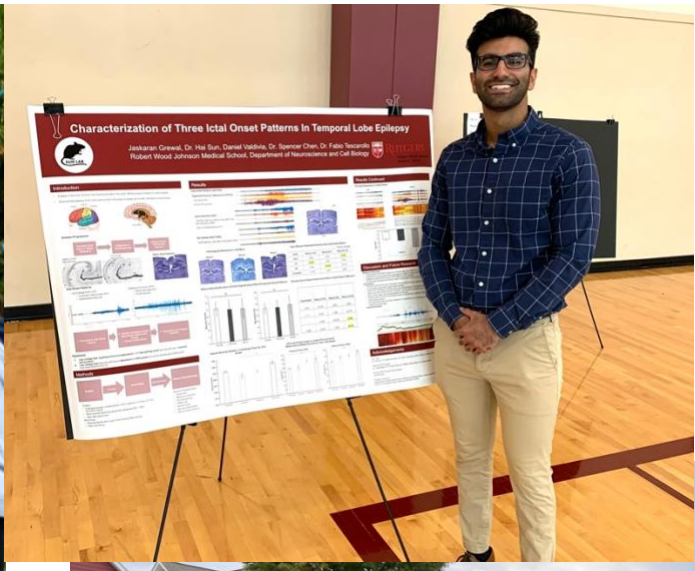

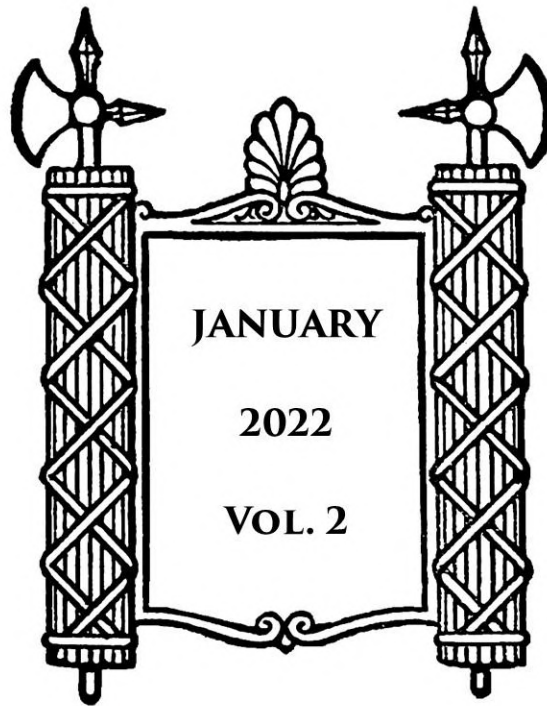
